This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. Music is taught in class every week and is informed by the model music curriculum (March 2021). Lessons are a minimum 30 minutes long and taught by class teachers. Teaching is supported by the Charanga Primary Music Curriculum which we use and follow. This musical learning is further supplemented by weekly singing assemblies through our choral partnership with St Paul's Cathedral. This session lasts for 30 minutes. Year 1 - 5 also have a separate 30 minute session with St Paul's.

Our music curriculum is further supported by our partnership with Music Masters. Every child begins their music journey in school through group activity with a focus on singing, percussion, movement and play. Violin tuition begins in Key Stage 1 with every pupil benefitting from small group and ensemble tuition alongside regular performance opportunities, strengthening links with parents and the wider school community. Instrumental tuition continues for many pupils in Key Stage 2.

### Part B: Extra-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

Through our partnership with Music Masters, children have violin tuition which is extra to the music provision. Fortnightly, musicianship lessons start in Reception and then pupils begin violin tuition in Year 1. In KS1, lessons are taught in groups and either trios or pairs and then individual lessons are introduced in KS2 for those pupils who continue with the tuition. For pupils in Reception and KS1, this is a free programme. Pupils who continue in KS2, parents are encouraged to pay a small subsidised fee.

Children can join the school choir, who perform at many local community events.

## Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Children will have the opportunity to perform or experience high quality music this academic year. Please see below for a list of those opportunities:

- Pupils busking with Music Masters at local venues
